"I bought this house for the view", said Churchill and it was his family home from 1924 until shortly before his death in 1965. The beautiful gardens and ponds that he created reflect his love of landscape and nature. The house is filled with personal belongings from every aspect of his life, giving a glimpse into the private world of one of Britain's greatest leaders.

This is a hilly site, so wear very sensible shoes and bring a stick or walking pole if this would be helpful. Members of the National Trust should bring their cards.

Since 1371 The Charterhouse has been a monastery, grand mansion, boys' school and an almshouse, which it remains to this day. All the residents are known as Brothers (even the women). One of the Brothers will take us on a guided tour of the house and we can also visit the glorious gardens.

Kensington developed from a village to the Royal Borough we know today during the seventeenth century when William and Mary moved from the Court at Westminster, preferring the more rural setting. Kensington developed around the Court and many of the houses we see today were built for courtiers. It became a Georgian Palace in the eighteenth century and in the nineteenth century Princess Victoria and her mother lived here before Victoria became queen. Many writers and artists lived in the area at that time. This walk will explore some of the beautiful Squares and streets that they lived in, and their fascinating stories. There will be time after the walk to visit Kensington Palace that was built by Sir Christopher Wren and see the stunning interior designed by William Kent.

The Wind (1928) is an American romantic drama directed by Victor Sjöström. Starring Lilian Gish, it is one of the last silent movies ever released by Metro-Goldwyn-Mayer and is considered among the greatest 'silent' films of all time. The performance features musical accompaniment from the Mighty Wurlitzer organ with Donald MacKenzie.

• Fleet Street & visit to Samuel Johnson's House ... Guided Walk & Visit 1pm, meet your Blue Badge Guide at Temple Tube Station on the Circle and District Lines. £14

Fleet Street is world-famous for its association with the newspaper world and the printing industry. On this walk we see many historical Fleet Street connections. The Oranges and Lemons church where Dr Johnson worshipped, The Royal Courts of Justice, Twining's Tea shop, Temple Bar, Hens and Chickens Court where the legendary Sweeney Todd had his barber shop, Samuel Pepys's birthplace and more..... We visit one of the famous local hostelries, The Cheshire Cheese. The jewel in the crown is the visit to Dr Johnston's House where for seven years he wrote his famous dictionary. A time warp of the 18th century and not to be missed! Please note there a lot of stairs to negotiate both in the pub and the house.

Enjoy a great day out at Chiswick House, a glorious 18th century house with 65 acres of wonderful woodland, lawns and landscaped gardens. Join our friendly and experienced guide for a fascinating tour of the stunning Grade 1-listed House with over 300 years of history, architecture and art to enjoy. There is a narrow spiral staircase to reach the first floor of the House. If you find this difficult to manage the House staff can provide alternative access via the external portico steps. Unfortunately, owing to the historic constraints of the building there is no lift access to the first floor of Chiswick House.
