Tuesday 1 September

- **Thames River Boat Cruise**
12 noon lunch will be served at Chiswick Pier House, Corney Reach Way, W4 2UG. The Pier House is a few minutes walk from Edensor Road/ Chiswick Pool, the last stop on the E3 bus. The entrance faces the Thames. You will be given a map showing the exact location when you book. £25

A light lunch will be served in the Pier House while you enjoy a beautiful view of the river. After lunch you board The Golden Salamander to take a leisurely cruise down the Thames to Westminster. The Golden Salamander is one of the most stylish and classic riverboats on the Thames. During the cruise there will be a commentary on the landmarks we pass. The bar will be open for you to purchase refreshments. An afternoon not to be missed.

Visit this spectacular baroque palace located on the bank of the River Thames. The original Tudor Hampton Court Palace was begun by Cardinal Thomas Wolsey in the early 16th century. It soon attracted the attention of Henry VIII who brought all his six wives here. When William III and Mary II took the throne in 1689, they commissioned Sir Christopher Wren to build an elegant new baroque palace at Hampton Court. Explore the wonderful gardens with a maze and huge vine and enjoy refreshments in the large café. Practical footwear recommended.

Dorich House is the former studio home of the sculptor Dora Gordine and her husband the Hon. Richard Hare a scholar of Russian art and literature. Dorich House is now Grade II listed. The Museum holds the world's largest collection of Gordine's work. Also on permanent display is an important collection of Russian art and artefacts, acquired by Gordine and Hare during their marriage. Please note the Museum is located over 3 floors and there is no lift.

In Dickens' time people were enticed to London by the promise of work and a better life. Charles Dickens was ten years old when he came to the city in 1822. It was still the city of Christopher Wren and the early Georgians, full of coaching inns and chop houses, much of it was still rural. By the time he died in 1870 it had become the largest city in the world. Dickens was a chronicler. He had the 'key to the streets' the freedom to roam. His description of the characters he met show the immense diversity of London Life. The noisy crowded streets described by Dickens were places of stimulation, excitement and adventure. Our walk will give an insight into both London at the time of Dickens and life in the city.

By Victorian times, London inner city burial grounds and churchyards were full to bursting, insanitary and insecure. Private companies were set up to create new cemeteries on the outskirts of town and one of these was Highgate. It became a fashionable place for burials and today you can see a wealth of amazing Gothic tombs dating from that time. Still used for burials, it has become a tranquil natural haven, home to foxes, masses of birds and other creatures.

A fascinating place to visit on our gentle guided tour that takes 90 minutes with lots of pauses, but not lots of places to sit down on the way. The ground might be uneven or muddy, so wear very sensible shoes and bring sticks with you if you find them helpful.

The Kent and East Sussex railway operates steam and heritage diesel trains between Tenterden & Bodiam, travelling through the Weald of Kent and Sussex. We start our day at Bodiam Station and travel to Tenterden on a diesel train. At Tenterden you can visit the Museum dedicated to the engineer Colonel Holman Fred Stephens who built the railway. Many of his artefacts, together with a photographic archive including over 3,000 images, are displayed in the Museum. The refreshment rooms at Tenterden are a great place to enjoy a sandwich or light lunch or you can stroll into the lovely town of Tenterden for a bite to eat and a stroll round the shops.

- **Pepys, Wren, Plague & Fire** **Guided Walk**

Two events that took place in the latter part of the seventeenth century were the Great Plague of 1665 and the Great Fire of 1666. Hundreds of thousands of people lost their homes to the fire and their lives to the plague. Four fifths of the City of London was destroyed including 85 parish churches. Three years after the fire, Christopher Wren was appointed Surveyor Royal and with Robert Hooke, one of the City Surveyors, re-designed and re-built 51 of the parish churches. Through the diaries of Samuel Pepys, it is possible to trace some of the areas that relate to these two stories. Our walk will explore these areas and consider Wren's concepts for the 'New City.'
